Programme Outline

It is one thing to be a director in a for-profit organisation, it is very different being a director of a nonprofit organisation or charity. The majority of board members for nonprofit organisations serve as volunteers without compensation. Notwithstanding this, they are fiduciaries who steer the organisation towards a sustainable future by adopting sound governance and financial management policies.

This introduction session is an engaging one. You will come up close and personal with those who are directors and deeply involved in the nonprofit sector. The session will cover essential aspects of:

- The directorship landscape
- Director's duties, responsibilities, liabilities and benefits
- The director's journey

So, if you have the desire of serving on a board of a nonprofit organization or have just started serving on one, this course would be a good one to give you the insights into the workings, risks and value of the nonprofit sector.

Taking only two hours, this session provides a broad roadmap for participants to digest as they consider the important role of a nonprofit director. Upon completion of this course, participants will be able to:

- Appreciate the macro view of the directorship landscape in Singapore, especially as it relates to nonprofit organisations.
- Identify the range of duties, responsibilities, liabilities and benefits of being a nonprofit director.
- Appreciate the key differences between a commercial and a nonprofit board.
- Make an informed decision before joining a charity board.
- Understand the next steps in their directorship journey.

Dr Chew is a Partner at PwC Singapore. He specialises in Strategy in the Entrepreneurial & Private Clients practice in the firm. In 2012, he was appointed to the board of Swee Hong Limited, an infrastructure and civil engineering company listed on the Singapore Exchange.

Dr Chew began volunteering at the National Arthritis Foundation (a charity with the Ministry of Health) in 1992 before being called to serve on its board in 2012.

In 2008, Dr Chew was awarded the Asia Brand Leadership Award for his outstanding contribution to the applied knowledge of brand strategy in management science. He has authored three books: *Killer Differentiators: 13 Strategies to Grow Your Brand*, *B2B: 10 Rules to Transform Your Business into A Brand*, and *Differentiation: How To Win In A Disruptive Market*.

Dr Chew holds a Doctorate in Business Administration from the University of South Australia, an MBA from the University of Strathclyde Graduate Business School (which he currently serves as a visiting lecturer), an Executive Diploma In Directorship from SMU/SID and successfully completed the Corporate Board Leadership program at Harvard Business School. He lectures at SMU Lien Centre for Social Innovation and served as one of the university's advisors in the Wharton-SMU-IBM Business & Industry Insight Program for 2012.

NSA SUBSIDY ELIGIBILITY & PAYMENT

1. There is NSA subsidy of \$83 per eligible senior for the cost of this programme.
2. An eligible senior must be a Singapore Citizen or a Permanent Resident aged 50 and above in the year of course commencement.
3. Seniors who wish to apply for NSA subsidy must submit the required information in the consent form in Appendix 1 for processing. On the day of the course, seniors are also required to bring along their original NRICs or FINs for verification.
